



Supporting students with Dyslexia

Tips to help children with their reading and writing

Be creative when teaching words.	Many, times schools have children rewrite the word. Use different colours to highlight the special letter. Make it fun!
Pick up a set of letters	Use a fun set of letters or make your own
Create a good base for reading and writing	Make sure the child understands the phonemes that we use in our language and reinforce that are especially difficult.
Advance through games progressively	After phonemes work with syllables.... Take the time to make sure your child understands every bit, step by step.
Personalise games for your child	If your child is engaged, they will have a higher chance of retaining the information.
Recognise improvement	Even if it's a small accomplishment, make sure your child knows that you noticed it and are happy for their improvement.
Do exercises that will complement their homework	Review the reading that they are doing in class, do some reinforcement reading.
Repeat directions	If your child doesn't understand immediately, repeat directions using drawings, coloured letters or anything else you may have.
