## **Subject: Music**

In Music we offer a curriculum that allows students to develop as performers and composers and to study how great musicians and composers have done this through time.

In Year 10 students develop their performance and composition skills whilst learning about different musical styles and important figures through focused listening.

Students will include details on these compositional features: melody, harmony, tonality, rhythm, and structure. 	<b>Task 2</b> - students will create three 30–60-second examples of ideas for music products related to a theme, using a range of realisation techniques.
