Pupil Premium Evaluation 2017 – 2018

Last year's outcomes for pupils were not good enough, their progress eight score was -0.37, this was due to weakness in middle leadership these have now have been addressed and there are now six new middle leaders in place.

There were gaps in the provision for SEND students, these have now been addressed and progress is now improving. Some pupils have made good progress in reading but progress overall was inconsistent and this is an area of focus for this year.

Summary of main barriers to educational achievement faced by Disadvantaged Students

The main barriers to educational achievement faced by our eligible students at our academy are;

- Quality of Education for SEND Students, including improving student attendance and reducing the number of Fixed Term and Permanent Exclusions
- To accelerate progress in reading for Disadvantaged Students
- To accelerate progress of year eleven students, including improving student attendance and reducing the number of Fixed Term and Permanent Exclusions
- To continue to improve the progress of PP Year 8 Students, including reducing the number of Fixed Term and Permanent Exclusions
