Students will be able to understand arguments for and against such themes from a range of religious and non-religious perspectives. This in turn builds students' tolerance, acceptance and mutual respect of a range of different viewpoints towards societal matters such as abortion, euthanasia and the death penalty. Students will also explore the different religious and non-religious perspectives as to what extent equality is celebrated. As a result of studying this module, students will gain the knowledge and understanding of the protected characteristics outlined within the Equality Act 2010 such as: gender, sexuality, disability and race. Acquiring this knowledge prepare students to make a positive contribution to with wider SCA community and for life beyond SCA.
