Recording, AO4 - Personal Response, through the themes of the 'Architecture' and 'Portraits' and "Natural Form". Pupils will then research and work in the style of a range of artists, using the artists' media and techniques. Once students have explored a range of artists, they will then create their own images experimenting with a range of different media and compositions. With the guidance of their teacher students will research ideas for a final piece and produce test pieces before creating their final piece.

Students will explore the 4-assessment objectives; AO1 – Research, AO2 - Media and Experiments, AO3 -
