Upon completion of the first unit, students will gain knowledge and understanding of the ethical and religious and non-religious perspectives for and against the use of a range of topics within the 'medical ethics' category. Students will be able to apply this knowledge and argue whether abortion and euthanasia are acceptable or not from a range of perspectives, as well as reaching a justified conclusion of their own. Students will also explore the different religious and non-religious perspectives on capital punishment, the use of drugs, vaccines and IVF treatment. Understanding a range of religious and non-religious beliefs and perspectives on current societal issues will lead to an increase in understanding, acceptance and respect for all within the local and wider community and prepare students for life beyond SCA.

In the second topic of Y9, students will study current issues affecting our society such as racism, discrimination, Islamophobia and hate crime. Gaining the knowledge and understanding of such topical issues will increase students' tolerance, respect and understanding towards a range of people from multi-cultural backgrounds. This also ensures that students are better prepared for life beyond SCA and have the ability to become role models and ambassadors within our diverse modern Britain.
