



Overview

In Year 11 students complete the second year of their GCSE course. They will prepare for and sit 4 exams for Spanish: Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing. Each of these exams is worth 25% of their final grade. Students begin the year with holidays topic which is a familiar topic from KS3. They will then move onto my town and local area seen previously in Year 9. The topic of jobs and future plans links to previous content seen in both Year 8 and Year 10. Students finish the year by preparing for the speaking element of the course and revisiting and revising previous content in order to successfully prepare students for their external examinations.
