We need your support in helping our Year 11 students commit to their success by striving to attend every day.

We know that those students with 95% attendance and above are more likely to gain five 9-5 grades at GCSE! This will give your child more choices post-16.

#ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

Missing just one day of school can be the difference between grades in Year 11 due to the sheer volume of work covered in a day. There are also lots of revision and enrichment opportunities for students if they attend school.

On average students who attend our revision offer improve on their mock grades by 2 grades!


PLAN AHEAD



Our Revision Offer



Morning Revision Club

Runs every day, all year from 8am. Students can drop in and receive a free breakfast in a quiet space to revise.

During mock exam windows, students will have compulsory morning revision sessions starting by 8am at the latest.



Period 6 3pm-4pm

Compulsory sessions for all students which take place all year round.

Monday - Maths

Tuesday - English

Wednesday - Science

Thursday - History or Geography one week and Spanish or Options the other week

Friday - no Period 6

Super Saturdays and Sundays

Take place in the lead up to mock exams and real exams to help students with final preparations for success.



Half Term Revision

Revision sessions will run during the February half-term, the Easter break and the May half-term. Sessions are open to all but students will be targeted for specific sessions.





HELPING YOUR CHILD WITH REVISION





REVISING EARLY

Starting early can help students avoid panic and stress, it can help them to get into good habits and they will be able to remember more of the material. Check in with them and their progress.



A revision spot with good lighting, the right stationary and no distractions such as the television or their mobile phone can help a child focus a lot more. Children focus best when the environment is quiet and tidy.

MORE THAN READ

Students will only remember around 10% of what they read. Help them by testing them and getting your child to create mind maps and flashcards. When children summarise key points from their revision book in their own words, it can help them retain a lot more of the information.

To access A level courses students will need to achieve at least a Grade 6 in the subjects they wish to study. Apprenticeship providers will expect a minimum of Grade 5s, including English and Maths.
