

You can choose to work on any topic by:


Typing one of the following in the Search for topics field:

Browsing the content by clicking on one of the main Strands:




STEP TWO: Choosing the right work

The difficulty level will be in line with that of your normal homework.

You can choose to complete questions that **introduce** the topic if you don't remember much about it, **strengthen** the topic if you need a recap or **deepen** the topic if you are looking to increase your knowledge.

An example of this is shown on the right with the topic of circles.

You will see the difficulty level is set to 5 (in the top right corner) but you can change this if you are finding questions too hard or too difficult.

Key Terms:

- Pitch** - How high or low a note is
- Tempo** - The speed of the music
- Dynamics** - The volume of the music
- Rhythm** - The length of the notes
- Tonality** - Major or minor - this effects the mood

Fun fact: The full name of the piano is the 'pianoforte', because it was the first keyboard instrument that could play both softly and loudly at the same time. Over time, people got used to calling it 'piano' for short.

Notation can tell us the pitch (note) and the rhythm (how long the notes are):

Rhythm Lengths:

Tea	1 beat
Chochochi	2 beats
Semiquavers	3 beats
Quavers	4 beats

Keyboard Skills / Exploring Classical Music/Ukulele Skills

Key Terms in Reggae:

- Skanking** - playing on beats 2 and 4 of the bar
- Drum Fill** - playing an exciting part on the drums usually in a gap in the music or between songs
- Patois** - Jamaican slang (words)
- Chord Sequence** - notes that chords go in
- Chore** - More than one note played at once
- Verse** - The main part of a song
- Chorus** - The main, repeated message of the song
- Drop** - The end of a song
- 4-4** - Four beats in a bar. The time signature of nearly all Reggae songs.
- Instruments used in Reggae:** Drum kit, Keyboard, Electric Organ, Bass Guitar, Electric Bass, Drums, Instruments, Single, Double, Double Bass

Time Signatures - how many beats in a bar:

4 beats in a bar
3 beats in a bar

Flat - makes notes a semitone lower

Sharp - makes notes a semitone higher
