



Overview

In Year 9, students continue to develop their knowledge of the building blocks of languages: phonics, grammar and vocabulary. Students revisit some topics from both Y7 and Y8 and encounter the topic of Spanish festivals for the first time. By the end of Year 9, students will have revisited the conjugation of past, present and future tenses and will delve into more detail of the concept of verb irregularity. Students will have also encountered more complex grammatical structures for the first time (including reflexive and modal verbs).
