In Year 7, students are introduced to the interrelated musical dimensions through performing, composing, listening and appraising. We begin with a unit on singing and the elements, building a unified sense of ensemble with classes, setting expectations for further work in large and small groups. Students will experience performing in front of an audience through whole class performance and Aspire opportunities.

Singing and the elements

- Vocal skills singing Baba La Gumbala.
- Developing understanding of dynamics, tempo and tonality through performance.
- Introduction to other musical elements (*Pitch, Tempo, Dynamics, Articulation, Tonality, Timbre, Duration, Structure*) as we learn to play Baba La Gumbala and then to create a variation.
- Describing music using appropriate musical language

Assessment:

- Recorded performance of Baba La Gumba
- Create a variation on Baba La
 Gumbala on
 soundtrap
 software.

Rhythm, pulse and notation

- Rhythm And Pulse learning about note values and simple rhythms
- Performing rhythms from notation as part of a class drumming ensemble.
- Understanding accents, dynamics and articulation.
- Reading treble clef performing 3-5 note melodies on keyboard, ukulele or guitar.

Assessment:

- Whole class rhythmic performance
- Performing 3-5 note melodies from staff notation.

Hooks and riffs, ensemble musician

- Introducing Repeated Musical Patterns
- Exploring Riffs and Hooks in a Popular Song 'Sweet dreams are made of this'.
- Exploring Repeated Musical Patterns in "Classical" Music Ravel 'Bolero'.
- · Improvising.
- Aurally recognising instruments
- Performing as class band/orchestra

Assessment:

- Performance of ostinato/riff as part of class orchestra.
- Improvisation recorded.
