

Students will explore the 4-assessment objectives; AO1 – Research, AO2 - Media and Experiments, AO3 - Recording, AO4 - Personal Response, through the themes of the 'Architecture', 'Portraits' and "Natural Form". Pupils will then research and work in the style of a range of artists, using the artists' media and techniques. Once students have explored a range of artists, they will then create their own images experimenting with a range of different media and compositions. With the guidance of their teacher students will research ideas for a final piece and produce test pieces before creating their final piece.

Gothic Architecture - Coursework - 60%

- Gothic montage
- Mono printing
- Ink drawing and collage
- Mono printing techniques
- Collagraphs of textures
- Lino cutting print making
- Acrylic painting

Fragments - Coursework - 60%

- Collecting primary research portraits taking fragmented photos
- Researching artists related to fragments. Jeremy Olson, Ed fair burn, chuck close.
- Create fragmented portraits
- 4 x A4 Developments, experimenting with materials and techniques
- 2 x A3 Developments, experimenting with materials and techniques
- A1 Portrait inspired by chosen artist

Fragments - Coursework - 60%

- Artist research and analysis
- Create a series of experiments inspired by artist
- Refine final experiments
- Create compositions of final piece
- 5 hour mock exam creating a final piece
- Review project as a whole refine outcomes.

Assessment:

- AO1: Develop ideas through sustained and focused investigations informed by contextual and other sources, demonstrating analytical and critical understanding.
- AO2: Explore and select appropriate resources, media, materials, techniques and processes, reviewing and refining ideas as work develops.
- AO3: Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions, reflecting critically on work and progress.
- AO4: Present a personal and meaningful response that realises intentions and, where appropriate, makes connections between visual and other elements.
