



The Business Studies Curriculum at SCA is knowledge rich, providing students with the knowledge and skills required to successfully run / contribute to a business beyond 16. The Level 1/2 Technical Award in Business and Enterprise is designed for students who want an introduction to business and enterprise that includes a vocational and project-based element. The qualification will appeal to learners who wish to pursue a career in the business sector or progress onto further study. Furthermore, this qualification provides students who are considering a career in a trade, the opportunity to understand what knowledge and skills are required to become self-employed. Learners could progress into employment or onto an apprenticeship. The understanding and skills gained through this qualification could be useful to progress onto an apprenticeship in the business sector through a variety of occupations that are available within the sector, such as marketing, finance, business administration and human resources.
