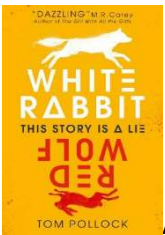


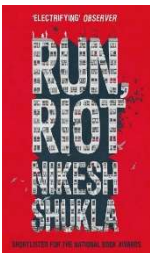

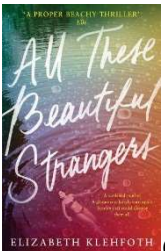

From the editor of *The Good Immigrant*, an adrenaline-fuelled, powerful YA thriller about alienation, gentrification and community.



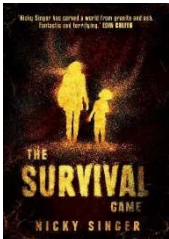

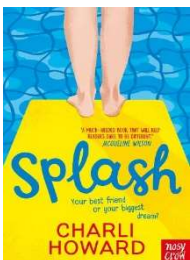

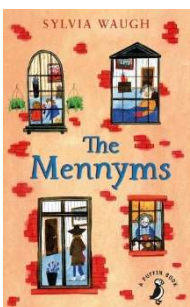
